Conferences are my favorite time of year. Although we know and understand the importance of ongoing communication between educators and parents, meeting face to face does something more for the students.

Think how important you feel when you know people are talking about your strengths and the things you do well. I can only imagine this is how our students feel after you spend time with their teacher talking about the importance of their education. As October comes to an end, parents/teacher conferences culminate and grade cards will be distributed. I would like to challenge you to take some time to reflect over the conversations you had with teachers and to better understand your child as a learner.

First, I would like to encourage you to talk with your students. Find out what they likes best about school, what subject area they feel they excel in or an area where they feel like they need support. Look at their work and ask specific questions that are relevant to them. This allows you to understand the scope of your child's learning and how to connect this to the information gained during conference time. Do this with loving care, so they don't feel like you are looking for the things they do wrong, but focus on what they are doing well.

Secondly, it is a great time to set a goal with your child. We constantly set goals for ourselves as adults and think how we feel when we achieve those goals. Our students are no different. Set an attainable goal with your child that focuses on what they do well. Let your child be creative, but specific, on what they would like to see for themselves this year. Maybe, they want to finish a chapter book in a week; maybe they will commit to doing their homework without an argument. Although these goals seem simple, they will make a great difference in your child's learning. Just the commitment alone makes a difference!

A continued thank you goes to all our families for your constant involvement, support, and encouragement that you provide to our students each and every day. The saying, "it takes a village to raise a child," has never been as important as it is today. With the increased level of rigor expected of our students to be our leaders of tomorrow, it takes all of us to educate our children, today, tomorrow, and forever!
