

Transitions services are a coordinated set of activities for secondary students with disabilities, designed to achieve specific outcomes, which promote movement from school to post-school activities. The coordination is carried out by the school district, with the active participation of the student, his or her family and appropriate community service agencies. The goal of transitions services is to ensure that students with disabilities are prepared for employment, post-secondary education, or community living when they leave school.
