
In the last newsletter of each month, we will dedicate this section to showcasing

News From Art:

We are ready to hit the trail. Our $3^{rd} - 5^{th}$ grade artist have been leading fashion designers and created just the right boots for trailblazing into learning. They have learned the meaning and used the elements of art: color, value, shape, line and texture. They have also learned the meaning and used the principles of art: pattern, balance, contrast, rhythm, emphasis, unity, and movement. Grades 1^{st} and 2^{nd} have also been learning and using the elements and principles of art. They have used color, line, texture and pattern to create colorful galloping steeds for their trailblazing adventure in the world of art. Kindergarten have been exploring shapes and finding they can be combined to create things we see in our world such as houses, trees, wagons, and even a sneaky cat. Ms. Locke read

the book <u>Mouse Shapes</u> by Ellen Stoll Walsh in which clever mice created giant scary mice using shapes to scare the cat away. Pre-K listened to the book, <u>Little Quack</u> by Lauren Thompson with pictures by Derek Anderson. They colored circles and ovals to create brave Little Quack swimming in the water.
