Mill Creek continues to achieve at high levels as seen throughout the classrooms each day. As Lead Learners (teachers and staff), it is critical that we face our current reality and make adjustments in our instructional practices to meet the demands of increased learning expectations, while continuing to meet individual learning needs. We celebrated the learning gains from last year's FSA assessment. In August, Mill Creek was recognized again this year as an A school. Throughout the state, schools saw a decline in student achievement measured by the FSA; however, Mill Creek students continued to show learning proficiency and even more important, increases in learning growth! We believe our students are so much more than a number so celebrating the growth of our students confirms that serving our students with prescribed learning experiences will continue to be our priority at Mill Creek. Although the FSA only illustrates a slice of the excellence in learning at Mill Creek, it does confirm learning is a MUST! Our school improvement plan identifies specific goals and action steps that Mill Creek will accomplish in the 2016 - 2017 school year. Our goals are to increase the percentage of students scoring proficient on the FSA assessment administered in 2017, and to continue to see our students at Mill Creek make learning gains. We believe EVERY student at Mill Creek is talented and we will provide what they need to be SUCCESSFUL! Our detailed plan will be updated and located on our webpage by mid-October.

Teachers and staff continually engage in learning opportunities to increase their level as a practitioner. As we prepare to reach the needs of every learner in our building, we strive to provide a rigorous education that equips our students with the necessary tools to be high achievers in a world that is ever changing. So, I leave you with this, we will do "Whatever It Takes," to meet the needs of our students.
