# MCA Learner's "Take Action!"

On Tuesday, April 2, our 4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup>, and 6<sup>th</sup> graders will take the FSA Writing Assessment. Throughout the building students engage in writing daily and are making great gains as accomplished authors. Writing in different genres - narrative, opinion, and essay, has given students the opportunity to learn different writing crafts and strategies while writing, in addition to learning how to use their writing as a platform for expressing their thoughts and ideas. For example, we teach students how to use "show not tell" strategies. We want our students to use their voice to show us how characters are feelings or portray their feelings in an essay, not just tell us about their characters. Ask your students to share their most recent writing with you and what they did as a writer to ensure the reader was influenced by their writing!

As lead learners in the classrooms, teachers have engaged in on-going learning together to build a deeper understanding of elaboration and the impact we can have on student writing when we study together vertically, K - 5, while our  $6^{th}$  graders have worked to develop their essay writing by giving meaning to the text evidence chosen to support their writing. Ensuring that our students are proficient writers means that we must understand and agree upon what writing looks like and how we will grow our writers each year. This isn't new at Mill Creek, as we believe that to provide the highest level of educational experiences to our students, we must continue to learn and grow as professionals.

In addition, our 3<sup>rd</sup> grade students will take the ELA FSA on Thursday, April 4 and Friday, April 5. They are ready to work hard and "show what they know."

As we come upon FSA Writes and 3<sup>rd</sup> grade ELA next week, we are confident of the learning and work our students are doing and know they will all do GREAT!

A few testing reminders as we move forward:

It is critically important that our students come with a well-prepared mind and body to do their BEST work. Please ensure that your child gets a good night's sleep, a well-balanced breakfast and most importantly is **HERE** and **ON TIME** to school next Tuesday. This will set them up for SUCCESS. 



# **REMINDERS**

**Arrival of Students**—Students may be dropped off during parent drop off time which is 8:05am-8:30am. Students are not to be dropped off before 8:05 am due to safety as there is no supervision before that time. Students arriving after 8:30 am are to be walked to the front office by a parent/guardian and receive a tardy slip before proceeding to class.

**Lost and Found**— Lost and Found is located in the front office. At the end of each month, items remaining will be donated. Please make sure to label all your student's belongings as we are able to return labeled items promptly to students.

**Free and Reduced Lunch** - As a reminder, free and reduced lunch accounts are good for one school year. You must reapply at the beginning of each new school year. **Attendance**— Any student who has been absent from school is to submit one MCA Absentee form the day the student returns to school stating the cause of the absence, completed and signed/submitted by parent/guardian. If your student has been out 3 (three) or more days, you will also need to provide a note from a physician. *There is no longer any reason to call in absences.* You will still receive the automated phone notification that your child is absent. Please note the list of excused and unexcused absences for the <u>District's attendance policies</u>. MCES Absentee form in two different formats: <u>MCA ABSENTEE WEB SUBMISSION FORM</u> or <u>MCA PRINTABLE ABSENTEE FORM</u>. For more information or if you have questions, please contact the front office at 904-547-3720.

School Access—As required by Florida state law, everyone MUST have a cleared background check to go past the front office at Mill Creek Elementary. Picture ID (driver's license) is also required to enter the building at all times. You MUST have a background check and be cleared to volunteer at the school, attend any conferences, attend field trips, and to have lunch with your child. So now is the time to go ahead and apply for school access! Please make sure all spouses, grandparents, siblings over the age of 18, etc. who may visit the school are also approved to enter the building. The cleared application is good for 3 years and can be updated in the front office or renewed at any time. At no time should you have to resubmit another application. If you have any questions or need further assistance please contact the front office.





Second Graders have been creating parakeets in the style of Kees Van Dongen, an impressionist painter (1877-1968).










Fifth Graders have mastered the "Great Wave" in the style of the Japanese artist Hokusai (1760-1849).

## **SUMMER MARINE SCIENCE PROGRAM**

## Parents,

Applications for the summer Marine Science Program were passed out at all schools during the week of February 12<sup>th</sup>. Applications were due back to science teachers by February 28<sup>th</sup>. Applications can still be downloaded at any time from the website prior to April 15<sup>th</sup> at <a href="http://www-grms.stjohns.k12.fl.us/marinescience/">http://www-grms.stjohns.k12.fl.us/marinescience/</a> The link also will have a complete day by day curriculum for each grade level, parent information, and a video from last year's program.

This summer program is available to all students currently in grades five through seven and has been sponsored by the school district since 1982. Three eight day sessions are held at Gamble Rogers Middle School with bus transportation provided. The dates for the three sessions this summer will be May 29<sup>th</sup> through June 7<sup>th</sup>, June 10<sup>th</sup> through June 20<sup>st</sup>, and June 24<sup>th</sup> through July 3<sup>rd</sup>. Small classes of 13-15 students are separated by grade level. All instructors in the program are St. Johns County School District teachers.

The Marine Science Program is a carefully designed experience for responsible students who are interested in learning about our local marine environments. Learning is "hands on" in the field with students kayaking, canoeing, boating, hiking, snorkeling, sailing, windsurfing, surfing, SUP, (stand up paddle boarding), etc. Specific grade level activities and curriculum are attached to the applications and are also available from the website.
