Focus Group Updates

Facilitator:

- Tim Forson spoke about various school opening stats: 46,308 enrolled, doubled from previous year
- District is looking for another K-8 school, as well as finalizing the current high school being built
- Math scores have gone done across the county, but also across the state
- Food service and supply chain, cost issues – no cost meals are becoming a problem
- Transportation now has AC, support service to other departments, drivers are 95% staffed and attendants are only 64% staffed, antimicrobial was applied on Sept. 5&6, increase to 240 routes, some have double or triple runs
- Parking is becoming an issue at the high schools, more students should ride buses, park outside of school, etc.
- Ramsay asks for donations to bus drivers via parents.
- Forson mentioned retention rates and issues with payment to bus drivers.
- COVID updates improved process of parents wanting to quarantine and getting info to parents, partnering with Flagler Plus to help with the influx of cases and quarantining
- Forson is short 50 custodians, COVID shortages, there are many critical temporary support staff needs
- Last year for FSA, accountability with stay with iReady and assessments, teacher feedback is that new curriculum is difficult

- Positives: Our district is the only district to have a nurse at every school; \$2M investment
- It is important to do what is best for the kids where we don't always know the immediate impact, requesting feedback
- Parents requested school dances & events, those events impact staff and facilities
- Discussion of traffic information and problems with Tocoi
- Dress code: do not use the word "distraction"

Principal's Report – School Improvement Plan 2021-2022/Information

- Updates: character parade this Friday (K-2 students will now be opened up for the parents to join to watch)
- Picture retakes are Nov. 9th, look in weekly news
- Nov. 11th Veteran's day no school
- COVID restrictions are changing and slowly being taken away
- School Improvement Plan draft is shown with scores & goals; goals involve students in the bottom quartile (bottom 25%). This includes students with special needs, low income, etc.
- Teachers are analyzing data to address subgroups and analyze student growth across the various assessments given throughout the year.
- Math learning gains will change to 52% from the previous year's goal of 50%. Teachers & staff will utilize formative and quality instruction, and PLC process to meet these goals.
- ESE students will be addressed and goals are set so student needs can be addressed.
- Behavior supports are revised and working to provide positive behavior support through the school
- Question asked regarding growth targets: How is the data looked at for each child? Growth targets or is it a whole-child approach? Goodwin, Ramsay, and Kaleigh provide input to parent.
