**Celebrating our Learners!** 

Celebrating our Mighty Mustangs as learners will always be a priority at Mill Creek! We celebrate the success of our students in a variety of ways! Character Counts, Mustang PRIDE, individual student learning gains, and my favorite, parent/teacher conferences. Our goal for October was to meet with EVERY Mustang parent/guardian. These face-to-face meetings provide teachers the opportunity to celebrate the work and learning of the students, get to know them a little bit better, and most importantly, strengthen the home/school partnership that is essential in the continued growth of our students. Thank you for making parent/teacher conferences a priority!

As we continue to move forward, I would like to challenge you to stay engaged in your student's learning. An important part of what we do with our students each and every day is provide learning that is meaning, relevant, and rigorous. In recent years we have studied as a collaborative team (Mustang teachers and staff) how identifying learning progressions and daily learning targets empowers students to become directly engaged in their own learning.

Providing learning targets and engaging students in developing and understanding "what" and "how" they are learning requires self-efficacy or what we like to call it sometimes is building "agency" in our students. *Agency in education means that students have the satisfying power to make their own decisions and choices, take meaningful action, and see the results in their own development and learning.* However, for students to develop agency, they must know what they are aiming for, their learning targets. This builds self-efficacy, a skill that is essential in adults and the work place. *Self-efficacy* is one's belief in one's ability to succeed in specific situations or accomplish a task and can play a major role in how one approaches goals, tasks, and challenges.

As parents, learning targets give you direct access into a child's learning during the day. Parents are great at asking the question, "what did you do today?" and the student replies, "nothing." However, asking a child, "What were your learning targets today?" provides a crystal clear focus. If a child responds, "I don't know," make sure they know their job the following day is to know and understand the learning targets for the day! Then follow up with the same question the following day. In collaboration, home and school, we will provide the support needed for our learners to build the skills needed to be successful throughout life. I would love to hear your feedback!

A continued thank you goes to all our families for your constant involvement, support, and encouragement that you provide to our students. The saying, "it takes a village to raise a child," has never been as important as it is today. With the increased level of rigor expected of our students to be our leaders of tomorrow, it takes "all of us" to educate our children, today, tomorrow, and forever! Stay involved, and together we will achieve EXCELLENCE! This is our COMMITMENT to ALL our learners!

### **UDPATED: ATTENDANCE POLICY**

- Regular attendance is important for your child's success in school. The county's attendance policy in its entirety can be found at <a href="http://www.stjohns.k12.fl.us/student/attendance/">http://www.stjohns.k12.fl.us/student/attendance/</a>
- UPDATED: Any student who has been absent from school is required to bring a completed and signed Mill Creek Absentee Note from the student's parent/guardian the day the student returns to school stating the cause of the absence. If your student has been out 3 or more consecutive days, you will also need to provide a note from a physician. Beginning January 1, 2018, the MCES Absentee Form will be required for all absences.
- Please call our attendance line at 547-3737 to report each absence. Calling the attendance line does not excuse the absence.
- The "Blackboard Connect" Rapid Notification system will be used to make calls to report student absences to parents.
- After 15 days of absence per school year, whether excused or unexcused, a student must have a doctor's verification for all subsequent absences. The following constitutes an excused absence: personal illness, illness of an immediate family member, death in the family, doctor's appointment, dentist appointment, religious holidays of the student's established religious faith, special events (when approved by the Principal).
- Students having a communicable disease or infection that can be transmitted to others are to be excluded from school and are not allowed to return until they are no longer infectious. (Florida Statute 1003.22).

The core resources that have been submitted for evaluation have come from the state adoption consideration lists. AP materials that will be reviewed are from College Board recommended materials.

Materials are available for review from 8:00 AM – 4:30 PM when district offices are open.

This document may be revised throughout the review process. Please check back for updates.

Please note the following Florida statute regarding instructional materials that pertains to parent input regarding adopted materials:

F.S. 1006.28 (1)(a)(3) Each district school board must establish a process by which the parent of a public school student may contest the district school board's adoption of a specific instructional material. The parent must file a petition, on a form provided by the school board, within 30 calendar days after the adoption of the material by the school board. The school board must make the form available to the public and publish the form on the school district's website. The form must be signed by the parent, include the required contact information, and state the objection to the instructional material. Within 30 days after the 30-day period has expired, the school board must conduct at least one open public hearing on all petitions timely received and provide the petitioner written notification of the date and time of the hearing at least 7 days before the hearing. All instructional materials contested must be made accessible online to the public at least 7 days before a public hearing. The school board's decision after convening a hearing is final and not subject to further petition or review.








## Mill Creek is Filling Up with Mustang P-R-I-D-E!
