I not only teach 4th grade at Mill Creek but am also a PROUD Navy wife and the mother of three brave "Navy Brats". We have all seen our service men and women around town and many of us have even gone out of our way to thank them for their bravery and service to our country. Have you ever thought about the family that supports that service member, though? Have you ever looked behind that military person to see the family carrying-on loving, supporting and staying strong while that service member is "saving the world?" Our military children are silent heroes that are resilient and strong and deserve our gratitude, too. These precious children "give" us their parents so that they can fight for our freedom.
