IMPORTANT REMINDERS

Arrival of Students—Students may be dropped off during parent drop off time which is 8:05am-8:25am. Students are not to be dropped off before 8:05 am due to safety as there is no supervision before that time.

Lost and Found— Lost and Found is located in the cafe. At the end of each month, items remaining will be donated. Please make sure to label all your student's belongings as we are able to return labeled items promptly to students.

Free and Reduced Lunch - As a reminder, free and reduced lunch accounts are good for one school year. You must reapply at the beginning of each new school year. The application can be found at https://mealapps.stjohns.k12.fl.us/

Attendance—Any student who has been absent from school is to submit one MCA Absentee form the day the student returns to school stating the cause of the absence, completed and signed/submitted by parent/guardian. If your student has been out 3 (three) or more days, you will also need to provide a note from a physician. There is no longer any reason to call in absences. You will still receive the automated phone notification that your child is absent. Please note the list of excused and unexcused absences for the District's attendance policies. MCES Absentee form in two different formats: MCA ABSENTEE WEB SUBMISSION FORM or MCA ABSENTEE WEB SUBMISSION FORM or MCA PRINTABLE ABSENTEE FORM. School Access—As required by Florida state law, everyone MUST have a cleared background check to go past the front office at Mill Creek Elementary. Picture ID (driver's license) is also required to enter the building at all times. You MUST have a background check and be cleared to volunteer at the school, attend any conferences, attend field trips, and to have lunch with your child. Please make sure all spouses, grandparents, siblings over the age of 18, etc. who may visit the school are also approved to enter the building. The school access application is on-line at: https://stjohns.keepntrack.com/apply. The cleared application is good for 3 years and can be updated in the front office or renewed at any time

Health—The purpose of School Health Services is to ensure that all students are healthy and ready to learn. We do this by providing screenings and referrals, administering medications and treatments, providing first aid, providing health counseling and education, and supporting students to acquire self-management skills.

Clinic Hours are from 8:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., Monday-Friday while school is in session.




Most Inspiring — The door promoted Acts of Kindness

upper grades have gone to París to learn the purpose of the Eiffel Tower. France is celebrating the 130th anniversary of the Eiffel Tower. This amazing architecture was built for the 1898's World's Fair in Paris. It served as the gateway into the fair and was over 1,000 feet tall. It was three times as tall as the Statue of Liberty. Eiffel's company also designed the support structure for the inside of the Statue of Liberty. At first, the French people thought the tower was an eyesore and dangerous. They thought it might fall and they wanted it destroyed. The Eiffel Tower is wind resistant and strong. Today it is considered a beautiful piece of art

Our students are creating the basic symmetry and shapes of the Eiffel Tower, but adding their own personal design and pattern.

The final artwork will be given a watercolor wash.



Instructional Materials Adoption 2019-2020

The St. Johns County School District curriculum department representatives and adoption committee members are currently conducting the review process for the 2019-2020 Instructional Materials Adoption for Career and Technical Education, Computer Science, and Foreign Languages resources. Please click here http://www.stjohns.k12.fl.us/media/instructional-resources-media-services/textbooks/adoption/ to obtain access to the resources that are available for review. The core resources that have been submitted for evaluation have come from the state adoption consideration lists when available. Additional resources for programs may be reviewed from materials listed as appropriate for the program indicated. If you are interested in serving on an adoption review committee, please contact the principal or assistant principal.

Resource lists may be revised throughout the review process. Please check the website frequently for updates.

Some print materials may be available for review. If you would like access to available printed materials, or require assistance reviewing the online resources, please call the Instructional Resources and Media Services office at 904.547.3947. Materials are available for review, by appointment, from 8:00 AM – 4:30 PM, when district offices are open.

Please note the following Florida statute regarding instructional materials that pertains to parent input regarding adopted materials:

F.S. 1006.28 (1)(a)(3). Each district school board must establish a process by which the parent of a public school student or a resident of the county may contest the district school board's adoption of a specific instructional material. The parent or resident must file a petition, on a form provided by the school board, within 30 calendar days after the adoption of the material by the school board. The school board must make the form available to the public and publish the form on the school district's website. The form must be signed by the parent or resident, include the required contact information, and state the objection to the instructional material based on the criteria of s. 1006.31(2) or s. 1006.40(3)(d). Within 30 days after the 30-day period has expired, the school board must, for all petitions timely received, conduct at least one open public hearing before an unbiased and qualified hearing officer. The hearing officer may not be an employee or agent of the school district. The hearing is not subject to the provisions of chapter 120; however, the hearing must provide sufficient procedural protections to allow each petitioner an adequate and fair opportunity to be heard and present
